### **Risen to Life in the Spirit**

The story of Jesus' resurrection is at the very core of our faith. It is a tale of triumph over darkness, of life emerging from the tomb, and of love conquering death. As we are moving through this Easter season, we are reminded that even in our own lives, there is hope beyond despair, light beyond shadows. The stone that was rolled away, revealing an empty tomb, speaks to the eternal truth that death does not have the final say. Christ's victory over death gives us hope, even in our darkest moments, that new life is coming. Let us hold fast to this hope, knowing that our own stories are woven into the grand narrative of redemption.

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate Pentecost—the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples like tongues of fire. 

### Photo Archives to be featured in slide shows of Maplewood History

Each month during this, our 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year, special "60<sup>th</sup> Moment" slide shows of photos from the past will be included in our normal congregation events, such as coffee hours, the Agape Dinner in May, etc. The shows will feature pictures from 1964 to the present of our congregation members and the many events that made Maplewood a vibrant, loving church and major positive part of Greensburg and beyond.

The 60th Committee has gathered and reviewed almost 4,000 digital photos of the past 60 years, from which the slide shows will be developed. The first show was presented at our recent March activity, Palm Sunday Brunch. 103 photos were featured and enjoyed by all. (Uh, some may not have actually "enjoyed" a pic or two, but at least found them interesting...) Many thanks to **Nathan LaSor** for his creative repeating loop presentation of the slides selected for this month.

Next up for April is a new slide show of 113 photos not included in the March show. The April slides will also feature our groundbreaking in late 1963 and construction of our church building in 1964... and more oldies and goldies of Maplewood members, many of whom are still active today.

### March 24<sup>th</sup> - Maplewood's Annual Palm Sunday Brunch:

The annual Palm Sunday Brunch was held after Service, with approximately 65 members attending. The meal was excellent, with the traditional ham and eggs, coffee cake, fruit cups and cookies!! A donation collection was taken, and a generous \$296 was raised to help defray the brunch cost. The "60<sup>th</sup> Moment" slide show focus was on our membership from the past & present . . . who they were, how the youngest of them have grown up (and too often, moved away), the many familiar and beloved faces of those who have passed into the arms of our Lord, in keeping with His promise on that Palm Sunday of long ago.

### **NEWS from SESSION in MARCH:**

There were no ACTION items.

**Financial Secretary's Report:** As of Sunday, March 24, \$2,255 had been received in special donations for the new Communion service. This has greatly exceeded the cost of the service at \$720. Since Session approved all extra money to be used for the 60th Anniversary celebration, the Mission and Membership Committee will have those funds available for future anniversary events.

**New Business:** Elder D. Costelnock raised the issue of how should our church reach out to the community, noting that Maplewood used to be known for its strawberry festival and, at that time, the community knew who and where MUPC was. After much discussion, ideas such as having a "neighbor day" inviting local neighbors to a function at the church to celebrate the 60 years we have been part of the community, inviting viewers of our YouTube page to come to church, reaching out to members who haven't been to church or its activities lately, and reaching out to the campus ministry program at U Pitt Greensburg, were sent to the Mission and Membership Committee for consideration.

### Committee Reports:

Worship & Education – Elder M. Cerilli reported that the new Communion service has been received. The committee is focusing on planning for the Agape meal at Pentecost on May 19 and the Teacher/Choir Appreciation Sunday on May 26. Finance – Elder S. Elkettani provided the February 2024 financial overview. Also, S. Elkettani reported that the online giving application has been submitted to the Presbyterian Foundation to establish an online giving program for MUPC. We have been notified that the application was received and is being processed.

<u>Missions/Membership</u> – Elder J. McNamara reported on the following committee activities: \*\*Planning for upcoming events: Agape Meal on May 19, future 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary activities. \*\*One Great Hour of Sharing is ongoing through Easter Sunday. Session News continued:

\*\*The Palm Sunday brunch was a successful event with 65 people in attendance, \$296 collected in donations, and many favorable comments on the slide show during the brunch. Thanks to everyone who volunteered and worked on the event!

\*\*High quality video of Pastor Steve's sermons continues to be produced and posted to the current website and Facebook page, with over 200 views the past week. New website content has been loaded and tested in preparation for the new site to go live.

**Property** – Elder D. Ferry reported that AARP continues to use Fellowship Hall for Tuesday and Thursday tax preparations for seniors and disabled people. Donations collected from those using this service have netted \$876 to date. D. Ferry also reported that the new color copier has been installed and he provided information on the machine.

# From the Emergency Planning Group (EPG)

Food for Health and Healing By Karen Bouknight

Welcome to the April update for the Emergency Planning Group! Our March "Scenarios" class had some new faces and just as importantly, some fantastic discussion. Our next Scenarios class is scheduled for May if you are interested in a "discussion format." The April 21 class will be the normal topic-based format.

The EPG is starting its third year here in the Spring of 2024. As in years past, we again encourage everyone to grow a portion of their own food. Now is the time to ready your seed and prepare your beds. Now is the time to add fruit bearing trees and bushes. It's a wonderful feeling to grow, share, and enjoy food as God intended. It's also a great feeling to not shell out so much money for food at the store.

In this month's class, we'll discuss growing common herbs and spices and using them fresh or drying them yourself. Whether you're growing them in your garden, in pots on your deck, or in containers on your windowsill – herbs are an easy way to add flavor to your food.

In addition to the obvious use in preparing food, we are also going to examine some of the medicinal uses and health benefits of certain herbs. We will cover some common herbs and spices, such as oregano and ginger, and also plants that aren't really herbs but have great health benefits such as garlic.


Even beyond health benefits though, we are going to examine a few supplements that have specific medicinal uses. One such supplement is called mullein. This plant cleanses our lungs and increases respiratory health. Have you had that cough that won't go away for weeks? Mullein may help you clear your lungs even more effectively than a steroid. Another interesting supplement comes from the moringa plant. It has tremendous anti-inflammatory properties, numerous vitamins and minerals, and amino acids. We'll discuss benefits and drawbacks, and of course, none of this is medical advice – be sure to consult your doctor, especially if you are already taking medication.

In this age of processed food and drive-thru nutrition, it is good to get back to things that God made and intended for us to eat and use for good health. Come to class to learn and give thanks to God. Maranatha!
